Art Appreciation

Catch these can't-miss, end-of-season shows

It seems like only yesterday season was upon us in South Florida. Now as the social season begins drawing to a close, residents and snowbirds are scrambling to catch the last events and exhibits before the galleries quiet down for the summer.

Society of Four Arts

In what is one of the most important art events on the gallery scene this season, the Society of Four Arts presents "Power & Piety: Spanish Colonial Art," through April 17 in the Esther B. O'Keeffe Gallery. Drawn from the Colección Patricia Phelps de Cisneros, the exhibition is co-organized by the Museum of Biblical Art, New York and Art Services International.

In particular, "Our Lady of Light" by Juan Pedro López (1724-1787) shines in luminous hues.

The remaining collection of 50 paintings and pieces of furniture, gold and silverwork was made in the Americas in the late 17th to the 19th centuries, and includes decorative devotional objects.
